Marc Intermaggio is responsible for overall management and operation of the Building Owners and Managers Association (BOMA) of San Francisco, one of the city's oldest business organizations and the largest association representing the commercial real estate industry. His primary responsibilities include strategic planning, labor relations and negotiation, external alliance management, program direction and the fiscal management of BOMA San Francisco.

Under Mr. Intermaggio's stewardship, BOMA San Francisco has witnessed significant growth in issues advocacy, career training, professional certification programming, and community involvement. During his tenure, BOMA San Francisco's service area has expanded to include Sonoma, Marin and San Mateo counties. To advance BOMA San Francisco's public policy objectives, he established multiple political action committees (PACs), and he was a driving force behind the formation of BOMA California, which promotes and protects the interests of commercial building owners on a statewide basis.

Prior to joining BOMA San Francisco, Mr. Intermaggio worked for Washington, D.C.-based BOMA International, where he served in a number of capacities, including staff director for BOMA's National Advisory Council, Manager of Governmental Affairs, and Editor of the association's monthly publication. He also served as the Washington-area editor for Buildings Magazine, a national trade publication, and was a member of the Consultative Council for the National Institute of Building Sciences. Mr. Intermaggio began his professional career with the Corn Refiners Association, where he served as the assistant to the director of public affairs. He also spent a brief period with the U.S. Civil Service Commission.

Mr. Intermaggio presently serves on the Board of Governors of The City Club of San Francisco; serves as Management Trustee for the Stationary Engineers Local 39 Apprenticeship Training Trust; and is President of BOMA International's Association Executives Council. Past leadership positions include Director, American Society of Association Executives (ASAE) and President, Northern California Society of Association Executives (NCSAE).

Mr. Intermaggio received a Bachelors of Arts degree in English from Guilford College in Greensboro, N.C., and is an alumnus of Stanford University's Leadership Academy. He resides with his two children in San Rafael, Calif.
